## Grant, city funds to provide new equipment at Cheese Park

Hoopeston has received a grant that will help provide new playground equipment at Hoopeston's North Side (Cheese) Park.

An \$8,383 grant was awarded by Cunningham Recreation, makers of playground equipment, to help offset the total \$22,405 of upgrades, said Ald. Alex Houmes, parks committee chairman, at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Funds for the remainder of the project, which will also include assembly materials and mulch, will come from the parks accrual fund, nearly all from a change in a planned vehicle purchase.

The parks department budgeted \$20,000 for a new truck this year but Houmes said a Club Car RT 4x4, for \$6,000, will save money and better meet park needs.

The utility vehicle will come with a hitch, snow blade and winch and, with a trailer, will be able to haul almost all of the park's trash barrels, he said.

Aldermen unanimously approved purchasing the playground equipment and the budget change.

In other business, Ald. Bill McElhaney said Steve Baker, water superintendent, has created files on each of the new fire hydrants, including a picture of each, where it is, how deep it goes and other information, as well as a place to keep notes on each hydrant. The water and fire departments will each have copies of the files for their records.

McElhaney also said that in the future, hydrants will not be used for art projects and asked Fire Chief Joel Bird to explain why.

Bird told the council that when firemen are on the way to a fire, they scan the sides of the streets for the red of the hydrants. Hydrants in the downtown area which were artistically painted by Hoopeston Area art students, are more difficult to spot.





• Heard from Darren Duncan. District 1 Vermilion County Board representative, who said the county land bank hopes to land a Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP) grant to help tear down blighted residential properties in Hoopeston and Georgetown.

Before he died, Ald. Randy Carter submitted a list of 14 residential properties to Duncan. That list and the ones in Georgetown, will be submitted by the land bank by the October 21 deadline.

The TARP grant program had \$1.5 billion available last year and has about \$2 billion this year and covers all aspects of the process, from purchasing properties, to demolition and disposal.
