HA drawing to raise money for activities with mower as prize

Hoopeston Area officials have a plan that will allow those in extra-curricular activities to raise money for their groups.

At Thursday's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting, member Chris Elliott unveiled the first Cornjerker Give-away. The plan is for students to sell 1,300 tickets each for this year's prize: a new John Deere mower.

For every \$10 ticket a student sells, the group he represent - whether band, a sport or other activity - will receive \$4, Elliott said. If all tickets are sold, a total of \$5,200 will go toward district extra-curricular activities. "We want our students involved," he said, adding the program will be district-wide.

The mower was expected to arrive Friday and students will begin selling tickets soon. The winning ticket will be selected at during the National Sweetcorn Festival over Labor Day weekend.

In other business, the board, in a 5-0 vote, approved a farm management agreement between the board and the FFA Alumni Association which allows the association to assume oversight of FFA field plots.

Board members Mark Schaumburg and Russ Walder were absent from the meeting.

Mary Bushong, alumni association president, said al-

lowing the association to take on the duties will allow FFA advisor Emily McCray more time for teaching and working with students in other areas.

FFA currently has six plots of roughly six acres each, Bushong said. Students will continue to work the plots and do bookwork while the association will make sure **See HA on other side**

If Hoopeston residents start sporting mullets and big hair, it's because this year's Cornjerker basketball team has them thinking back to the 1980s, when another Hoopeston team was in the spotlight.

Hoopeston Area took the top prize in the Saturday's championship game of the Vermilion County Tournament.

Eight 3 pointers helped boost the Cornjerkers over Westville, 59-33 at the Palmer Arena in Danville.

Logan Walder let scoring with 18, including two from beyond the arc. Graham Eighner led in 3 pointers with five and a total 15 points for the game. Ryan Drayer completed the lineup of 3s and had seven total.

Rounding out scoring, Trey Layden added 10, Lucas Hofer scored five and Bailey Crose and Riley Wyss each had two.

The team is at 17-1 and last week was named #1 in the News-Gazette weekly poll and tenth in the most recent Class 2A poll.

The team is scheduled to face Georgetown-Ridge Farm on Tuesday night and Salt Fork on Friday, both VVC conference games.

In the third place match, Bismarck-Henning defeated Oakwood, 59-32 and Salt Fork topped Georgetown-Ridge Farm for fifth, 43-37.
