

2017 Festival logo is homage to corn, series-winning Cubbies

PJ Clingpeel is a big Cubs fan. He's also chairman of the 2017 National Sweetcorn Festival. The logo he chose for the festival combines the two.

The logo was designed by Jamey Colleen, a student in Kevin Root's Photoshop class at Hoopeston Area High School. Based on the outfield wall at Wrigley Field, it has an ivy-covered chain link fence as a background for a scoreboard promoting the festival, which will run from August 31 to September 4 this year.

The Wrigley wall has the ivy cut out in several places with the distances from home plate to the spots painted in the openings. Clingenpeel's logo has the same openings, with 1941 and 2017 - the starting and current years of the festival - on the exposed brick.

The design includes this year's slogan, "Shucking Open a New Door." Clingenpeel apologized to anyone working corn this year, saying he's been told anytime "shuck" is used, volunteers end up shucking the corn.

He also announced that Jo Dee Messina will perform the Saturday might of the festival. Tickets will go on sale soon and will be available through the Hoopeston Jaycees website, www.hoopestonjaycees.org.


