Hoopeston Area High School officials are working with Hoopeston Police Department to find students responsible for posting threats on social media last week.

Supt. Hank Hornbeck said Friday that "alarming" messages were posted on Twitter and Instagram, including "pictures of things that are not nice," insinuating bodily harm.

Administrators and police are working to find out how many students are involved and who posted the material. In an effort to "cloak themselves, so to speak," students have changed IP addresses, switched phones and used other measures, Hornbeck said.

Police have talked to students and there was an increased police presence in the school last week, he added.

Activity seems to have started before last week but

"started to get serious early (last) week," Hornbeck said.

Some parents took to social media on Thursday, asking whether other parents were sending their children to the high school. Some parents opted to keep students home while other parents said they contacted police and were told it was safe for youngsters to attend.

At Thursday's board meeting, the district issued a statement, which read:

"Hoopeston Area School District is aware of the alarming information that has been on various social media platforms as of late. We are working closely with local law enforcement officials. We want to thank law enforcement for their assistance in the matter, and ask that anyone who has any information to report it. Student safety is our number one priority."

Board officially approves retirement for Hornbeck, others

Hoopeston Area Superintendent Hank Hornbeck's June 30 retirement got official approval at Thursday's district school board meeting.

The board unanimously affirmed Hornbeck's retirement, as well as those for Maple teacher Annette Lockhart; high school guidance counselor Kay Brown; middle school teacher and coach Rich Stipp; and Maple principal Lori Eells.

All but Hornbeck's will be effective at the end of this school year.

In other personnel issues, the board approved transfers of Cheryl Overlander from sixth grade special ed to fifth grade special ed; Kristy Garrison from middle school aide to John Greer aide; and Angela Simpson from Jon Greer aide to middle school aide, effective August 17. In other business, the board:

• Set the annual board/administrators retreat for 6-9 p.m. March 13 in the high school library.

• Learned the next meeting will be held Tuesday, March 14 at the middle school and will include reports from the Response to Intervention (RtI) and curriculum coordinators and community liaison. The annual board photo will be taken prior to the 6:30 p.m. meeting.

• Learned Maple School's Jump Rope for Heart raised more than \$10,000.

• Heard from transportation coordinator Mark Eighner that Denise Bray has taken over scheduling extracurricular buses, replacing Nancy Stipp, who retired.
