Maple School to get new iPads thanks to teacher's grant

Some Hoopeston Area students will be getting updated technology thanks to their teacher.

Sara Troxel, Maple School multi-grade classroom teacher, applied for and received an Excellence in Education Grants for Teachers award from the Illinois Retired Teachers Association Foundation.

In her application, Troxel wrote about the iPads used by her students, which would no longer be able to be used after July of this year. She wrote that her students used the devices for many learning activities

and skills practice and that some students also use them as communications devices.

For her efforts, Troxel received a \$375 grant to purchase new iPads.

In total, the Excellence in Education Grants for Teachers program gave out \$36,5000 in grants in September..

The foundation is affiliated with the Illinois Retired Teachers Association, a lobbying group for retired educators.
