County officials take deed to former post office, courthouse

An historic Danville Building is now in the hands of Vermilion County officials.

On Friday, county board Chairman Mike Marron accepted the deed for the building at 201 N. Vermilion, which served as a federal post office which then became a federal courthouse until federal court services moved to Urbana.

The building was erected in 1911 and it served as a post office until the General Services Administration (GSA) assumed responsibility for it in 1988.

County officials received much help in taking on the building from U.S. Rep. John Shimkus (R-IL 15), who was in Danville Friday to mark the change in ownership. See DEED on other side

"We are deeply grateful for Congressman Shimkus' efforts and support in obtaining the building," said a press release issued about the change. "There was no purchase cost in obtaining the building."

Officials also had thanks for the GSA and its representative, Arthur Ullenberg, the National Park Service and Alesha Cerny, a park service historian.

The park service will assist the county in maintaining the historic site. The Illinois Historical Preservation Agency will also aid and advise in maintaining the structure.

The county board office and meeting chambers; supervisor of assessments, treasurer, recorder of deeds, county clerk, emergency management agency, technical services department and city election commission offices will relocate to the historic building. A date for the move has not been announced. "It will take some time to prepare and complete the move and no interruption in services is anticipated," the press release stated. "There will be much planning and activity to accomplish this move, but the county will be well served by the new location of vital offices."
