Alfie Coon remembers Honor Flight at Veterans Day service

For Vietnam veterans, the cold reception they received coming home from the war is hopefully softened by the reception they now get going to and coming home from Honor Flights.

Alfred "Alfie" Coon would know something about that. An Air Force veteran, Coon, 71, became a staff sergeant and was crew chief of a C-130B. Among his awards is a Bronze Star.

Coon was the keynote speaker at Saturday's Veterans Day ceremony, where told about his 2016 Land of Lincoln Honor Flight to Washington, DC in October 2016.

Each veteran travels with a guardian, and for Coon, that was longtime friend Jerry Hopkins. The two, along with Hoopeston veteran Howard Gaddis, flew from Springfield to Washington, DC on a one-day trip to see the memorials and visit with other vets before returning home.

Part of Coon's address included a video containing a CBS segment on Honor Flight and photos of the memorials and other sights veterans toured while in Washington.

One of the best parts of the flight, Coon said, was Mail Call, where veterans received cards and letters from people, thanking them for their service. "I didn't expect that," he said.

Unlike the veterans' first homecoming after the war, the Honor Flight homecoming was warm, as family and community turned out to welcome the returning heroes.

Returning to the podium after the video, Coon wiped tears from his eyes. Of visiting the memorials, "I wish I'd done that many years ago," he said. Concluding his remarks, he received a standing ovation from the crowd.

Honor Flight began in 2004 when Earl Morse, an Ohio physician's assistant, veteran and pilot, who worked for Veterans Affairs, realized many World War II veterans would never be able to see the memorial created in their honor. He asked one of his World War II veteran patients if he could fly him to see the memorial.

In 2005, six small planes flew 12 World War II veterans to visit the memorial in Washington and Honor Flight Network was born.
