Students were tested in seven different academic areas which included mathematics, physics, chemistry, biology, English, engineering graphics and computer science. Ten high schools, represented by nearly 140 students, participated. Participants came from Armstrong Township, Bismarck-Henning-Rossville-Alvin, Chrisman, Danville, Georgetown-Ridge Farm, Hoopeston Area, Milford, Oakwood, Salt Fork and Westville high schools.
