Signups will be held from 11:30 a.m.-12:45 p.m. at Hoopeston VFW, 428 W. Orange. Cost is \$15 per person or \$25 per couple. Kickstands go up at 1 p.m.,

although all vehicles are welcome, whether two wheels or four.

Stops will include Lola's Pub in Potomac; a stop in Carbondale, Ind.; Squeeze Inn at Oxford, Ind., Old Main Pub in Milford and Rangers Pub in Rankin before returning to the VFW.

Food and music will be available at the VFW, with Mason's Jar band at approximately 7:30 p.m.

Those not attending the poker run can come for food and music for a freewill donation.

For the second year, proceeds will go to Children's Dyslexia Centers of Central Illinois.
