Drollinger scholarship honors those who are kind to others

A new scholarship was established at Hoopeston Area High School to help a student who lives the words "Be kind to one another."

The Mark Drollinger Memorial Scholarship was started by Ralph (Pee Wee) and Jean Drollinger in honor of former Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger.

Drollinger, who died July 6, 2017 after battling oral cancer, always encouraged people to be kind to one another.

Pee Wee came up with the idea for a scholarship in Mark's memory, Mrs. Drollinger said. The former chief "was always about kids. He was always about kids getting an education. He was drawn to people who helped other. We knew that's what he would have leaned to."

Mrs. Drollinger and her son, Phillip Hollen, talked with school officials about establishing the scholarship and arranging the financing. Three students applied for the \$500 stipend this year.

Taylor Ankenbrand was the inaugural recipient of the scholarship, presented Tuesday evening at Hoopeston Area High School's Senior Awards and Honors Night.

Ankenbrand, daughter of Carl and Kelly Ankenbrand, was presented the award by Nina Drollinger, Mark's sister.

Mrs. Drollinger said Ankenbrand was chosen because of her volunteer work - "She volunteers at three different places," - and because of her involvement in the D.A.R.E. program. She is also working to save money for college. "She's just a go-getter. She really is," Mrs. Drollinger said.
