Prairie Meadows II to begin leasing houses in late August

Vermilion County residents now have another option for decent, safe, and sanitary housing. Prairie Meadows Phase II located at Route 9 and South Market Street in Hoopeston, is scheduled to lease up beginning in late August.

Crosspoint Human Services Property Management team is tasked with leasing the new two- and threebedroom homes to those who qualify.

Crosspoint already manages the first phase of Prairie Meadows which was placed in service in 2010. Together, the two phases contain 55 units of affordable housing.

Prairie Meadows Phase II is a Tax Credit Affordable Housing development for working families. Families must have enough income to pay rent, utilities and credit obligations without exceeding 80 percent of their income per month. There are also income limits per family size.

All adult applicants will be subjected to checks of credit, criminal, and rent payment history. Applicants who meet development preferences will receive priority placement at Prairie Meadows Phase II.

Tenant selection criteria and applications are availa-

ble at the Hoopeston Multi Agency Service Center, 206 S. First Ave., and at The New Holland Apartments at 324 N. Vermilion in Danville.
