Hoopeston man's labor of love tested in hot and dry summer

Hoopeston is benefitting from Bobby Pierce's love of landscaping.

Pierce is Hoopeston's newest parks department employee. Brought on part time, he was moved to full time two weeks ago. He has been tasked with, among other things, bringing to fruition Ald. Alex Houmes'

goal of improving the appearance of Hoopeston's parks.

On Tuesday, the Elm St. entrance to McFerren Park was on the receiving end of Pierce's efforts. Water flowed from a tank on a utility vehicle to a collection

of greenery, including Japanese maples, evergreens expected to reach 15', and dwarf varieties of weeping white pine, arborvitae and a spruce with tiny cones that are supposed to turn purple in the fall. "We wanted to plant different things with different textures and different growth patterns," he said.

While water flowed to the young plants, Pierce incorporated decorative rocks around plants, stopping occasionally to move the hose to a different plant.

Pierce said his wife, Marta, who oversees Hoopeston water billing, saw a picture of landscaping using rocks to give a terraced look. Pierce hopes to recreate the look at the Elm entrance. With plants and rocks in place, the area will then be covered with black mulch, like other park areas.

You might think creating that look would be the most difficult part of the project, but this year, keeping the plants alive is more challenging.

"I don't remember a year like this," Pierce said of the sustained high heat and lack of rain. He should know, having been in the landscaping business for more than 30 years. He then worked at and had shortlived retirement from Silgan Containers before joining the parks department. Pierce even comes out on his days off to water the tender plants. 'I don't care if I don't get paid," he said. "You can't spend \$200 on a tree and then just wait for it to rain."

It would seem it's feast or famine when it comes to rain and Hoopeston landscaping.

In 2012, the Pierces' son, Evan, landscaped the welcome area on the north side of Main St. at Rt. 1. Rainwater runoff from nearby properties at higher elevations damaged the plants.

Last year, the Pierces, working with Hoopeston's street/alley, water/sewer and parks department, revamped the area, building a berm and increasing drainage to help plants thrive.

Not all Pierce's efforts have involved new plants. When the Dixie Highway display was taken down to make room for the new First Farmers Bank, Pierce uprooted 13 plants, replanting them at the McFerren Park gazebo.

Along with the park entrance, Pierce has also freshened the area of the Veterans Memorial and has done some work by the Vietnam Memorial, as well as planting trees at McFerren and Cheese (Northside) parks.
