

Fire chief: over-zealous hydrant testing triggered boil order

Oops.

Last Monday's testing of fire hydrants caused low pressure in the water system, resulting in a boil order that lasted into Wednesday.

Firefighters were on the northeast side of Hoopeston. One group had difficulties shutting down a hydrant while those ahead continued opening them. "We opened too many at one time," said Fire Chief Joel Bird. The process drained a great deal of water from the aerial tower, resulting in the pressure drop.

The procedure used Monday was new, an effort to keep from breaking mains, which has happened during previous years' tests. By opening and closing hydrants, the plan was to keep pressure off of the mains. "We got a little over-zealous," Bird said, "We take full responsibil-



and the city's water system. The department's oldest truck is a 1991 model, while some of the city's water mains are vintage 1890, he said.

Firemen test hydrants because city water employees are busy with other water-related tasks and don't have time to test each one. As they find hydrants that don't open or won't work, firemen notify the water/sewer department, which then replaces hydrants.

The benefit of doing the testing themselves is that in the event of a fire, firefighters know which hydrants work and which don't. For example, when the Dyer mansion caught fire in August 2015, firemen knew the hydrant at Fifth St. and Honeywell was not working and immediately hooked hoses to the hydrant at Fourth St., saving valuable time.

Another benefit of firemen doing the testing is they can use the information in reports to the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). The ISO sets specifications for various organizations, such as fire departments, which are ranked by their scores on ISO benchmarks. Those rankings affect homeowner insurance rates; by keeping records on testing, Hoopeston Fire Department helps keep insurance rates lower than they otherwise would be

Testing also provides a chance to educate newer firefighters and serve as a refresher to more seasoned members.

The department will do more testing beginning at 6 p.m. July 16 and 23 and, if needed, on July 30. Bird said groups of two to four firemen will be more spread out than they were last week. "They won't be on consecutive streets," he said.
