HA basketball coach resigns for second time this year

For the second time in less than a year, Matt Colston has resigned as Hoopeston Area head basketball coach.

At a special meeting Monday night, the district board, in a 5-1 vote, accepted Colston's resignation. Lisa Leigh was the sole no vote.

Sixteen people spoke on Colston's behalf after board President Mark Schaumburg told the audience that speakers would be limited to three minutes each and that anyone attacking the board, being rude or obnoxious would be removed from the meeting.

Supporting the coach were the basketball team, parents and fellow coaches. Players called Colston "a great coach," "best coach we ever had" and said "he pushed us to be better."

"He makes us better people and more respectful people," said Keegan Roark.

Ross Bryll, head girls basketball coach, said Colston "is definitely held to a different standard." Bryll asks for things and is told yes, while Colston asks for things and is told no. "He does more for this school than any other coaches," Bryll said. "To fire him because of personality clashes (is wrong). If it can happen to him, it can happen to any of us."

American Association of School Administrators (AASA) that relies less on test scores and more on what it calls "new research-based metrics" to determine if high school students are ready for college, career and life.

According to AASA literature on the program, "standardized test scores - traditionally used as the primary readiness indicator - do not always provide an accurate representation of our students' potential. Today's students are driven by ideas and innovations. They should not be reduced down to, or defined by, a single test score. Our students are MORE than a SCORE."

Ways of achieving that goal include offering students classes in both career and college paths, dual enrollment in college courses and internships in local businesses, among others.

High school principal and assistant principal John Klaber and Kimberly Hutzel presented information on Redefining Ready and Kevin Root, business/ accounting teacher, had suggestions for long-range programs, if the board is willing. Those programs include help desk certificates, with testing by Adobe; Amazon Store; School Spirit Store, Cornjerker Café; Distribution Education Clubs of America (DECA); screen printing at the school; curriculum development; internships; and courses in programming/ coding game design, service and product marketing and introduction to small business; and a think tank for future planning.

Klaber said "If we are able to expand our programs, there are cost savings, not just money going out, it'll bring money into our school."
