Ag department finds buyers for C & S grain

Three buyers have been found for an estimated two million bushels of grain stored at C & S Grain facilities.

Kaufman Grain, 309 E. Attica Rossville, will purchase some of the grain, said Patrick Hogan of the Department of Agriculture Public Affairs Office.

Other buyers are ADM in Decatur and United Feeds, Inc., with offices in Royal and Clinton.

The agriculture department is selling estimated amounts of grain, Hogan said. The two million bushel figure resulted from physical measurements of storage facilities at C & S sites in Henning, Bismarck, East Lynn Prairie Green and Alvin.

The grain is currently being delivered to the three companies, Hogan said. Once at the destination, grain will be weighed and final amounts agreed upon.

Meanwhile, today is the second day of hearings between former C & S producers and an ag de-

partment hearing examiner.

Hearings are being held at the Rossville Church of Christ, 514 E. Attica, and are expected to end tomorrow

Certified letters telling producers when to appear at the hearing were sent to all farmers filing claims against C & S, Hogan said.

The hearing officer will, tell farmers immediately whether their claim is valid.

Producers will receive 85 to 100 percent of the value of their grain. Those with contracts with C & S will receive a minimum of 85 percent, while those who stored grain but did not sell it to C & S will receive 100 percent, Hogan said. Producers with contracts may receive up to 100 percent if the company's liquidated assets will cover that amount, Hogan said.

C & S owner Steve Syfrett surrendered the company's grain storage and warehouse licenses in December after the licenses were suspended by the ag department.

World traveler to address women at East Lynn

A woman who has traveled the world will be coming to the East Lynn United Methodist Church for a woman's retreat.

Ellen Stamps, former personal secretary to Corrie ten Boom, will speak at the Feb. 26 retreat, Women Ministering in Everyday Life - You Are the Light of the World.

Stamps, who grew up in Holland, became secretary to ten Boom, whose family helped hide Jews during the Nazi Holocaust.

Ten Boom and other members of her family served time in Nazi concentration camps for their efforts.

Stamps, who now lives in Minneapolis, will speak about her experiences with ten Boom during the morning session of the retreat, which begins at 9 a.m., said Deanna Umbanhowar, one of several women helping stage the event.

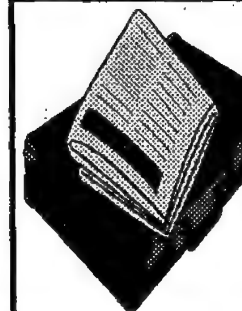
