



McChanges coming to Hoopeston restaurant

Old favorites - and some new treats - will soon be enjoyed in a different ambience at a local eatery.

McDonald's restaurant on Route 9 is undergoing a facelift, said manager Sara Fourez.

The restaurant's lobby and interior are being remodeled. "It's not going to be a 'BOOM!, overnight thing," she said. "It's going to be about a four-week thing."

New lighting is planned, as is a new ceiling, floor and furnishings. Owners Ric and Jan Richards also plan a play area for children, which will include the current Legos table, plus basketball and a puzzle table. The corn motif, which has adorned the restaurant for several years, will be discontinued.

Fourez said the eatery also plans to add programs for children and adults, such as Kiddy Bingo and a special breakfast event for senior citizens. "McDonald's has so much to give and we don't want to be held back," she said.

not be deprived of change, either, said Fourez. Plans include a face-to-face drive-through, where customers place orders with employee at one window, then pick food up at a second window, eliminating the headphones and speakers system now used, she said.

McDonald's menu will also change starting with the grand re-opening the first week of April.

A weekend breakfast buffet will feature biscuits, gravy, sausage, hot cakes, grits, crispy fried cube potatoes, fruit, scrambled eggs, egg toppers, blueberry and maple syrup, apple and bran muffins and apple and cheese danish.

The breakfast buffet will cost \$3.99, \$2.99 for senior citizens, \$1.99 for children aged four to 10, and 99 cents for children under four. Prices include drinks, Fourez said.

The expanded menu is part of the company's commitment to Hoopeston, she said. "We're going to stay here forever because we love Hoopeston and Hoopeston has loved McDonald's," she said.
