

Discrepancy noted in claims against C&S

A discrepancy between the amount farmers have claimed against C&S Grain and what the company said it owes producers has resulted in a hearing scheduled for Friday.

U.S. bankruptcy judge Gerald Fines has set the hearing for 10 a.m. Friday at the federal courthouse in Danville.

At issue is a discrepancy between farmers' claims against the company, totalling \$8.5 million, and company records, which reportedly show the total should be slightly over \$8 million.

The farmers' claims total is based on 262 farmers receiving payment at 100 percent and 196 producers receiving 85 percent payment.

If all producers received 100 percent payment,

the claims total reportedly would be \$8.9 million, according to the state Department of Agriculture.

C&S filed a motion last week asking that the department turn over copies of the claims, filed by producers last month. The department alleges the company's request is a delaying tactic, used to put off paying producers.

C&S owner Steve Syfrett voluntarily surrendered the company's grain and warehousing licenses in December of last year. The surrender came after the state suspended the licenses.

C&S operated facilities in Henning, East Lynn, Alvin, Fountain Creek and Wellington.

Producers attended hearings on their claims against the company last month.



DANVILLE—Area residents who come across hazardous materials during spring cleaning in their homes will have an opportunity to dispose of the materials at no charge.

The Vermilion County Health Department is co-sponsoring a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. April 9 at the Illinois Power building, 1155 E. Voorhees in Danville.

On that day, residents can bring toxic or flammable materials from their homes and have them unloaded and disposed of by hazardous waste contractors working in cooperation with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

Materials that will be accepted include oil and latex paints, antifreeze, cleaning products, used motor oil, gasoline, insecticides, aerosol products,
