Doctor offers services to Hoopeston Area schools

A Danville physician has offered his services free of charge to help some special local students, but whether the offer will be accepted remains to be seen,

Dr. Richard Elghammer, of the Elghammer Family Center, Ltd., has offered to help the Hoopeston Area district deal with students who have Attention Deficit Disorder and Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADD/ADHD). Elghammer specializes in treating such children.

The doctor's offer is for five years and includes eight hours of inservice training for teachers per school year; educational packets summarizing currend research on ADD children; community support for families of ADD children through the YMCA support group in Danville; access to the Elghammer Family Center's educational library of ADD videos and books; and continuous consultation concerning ADD issues and medication.

The usual fee for a one-day inservice is about \$2,000, Elghammer said. Waiving the fee is his way of giving back to the community and of getting ADD/ADHD information into schools. "I'm not going to let anything get in the way of this," he said. "It's the type of thing that, if you get it

started in one school, maybe it will have a domino effect. If I didn't do this, it might die, and I couldn't live with that."

Whether the district will accept the offer has not been decided, according to Don Dean, Hoopeston Area superintendent.

Dean said Hoopeston Area teachers participate with other districts in northern Vermilion County on training. Other districts would have to be involved in deciding whether to accept. "I wouldn't ride off on a horse by myself," Dean said, adding that superintendents from the northern area will probably meet this month.

A decision will probably not be made for about two months.

Hoopeston Area began looking at a policy after parents attended the December 1993 school board meeting, requesting the district formulate a plan to deal with ADD/ADHD students.

Dean is expected to announce a policy at Thursday's school board meeting that, while not dealing specifically with ADD/ADHD, will cover those students. "It will cover any handicap which substantially affects the students that isn't covered by special ed," Dean said.


