Government not the prescription for ailing health care

A seminar was held last Friday on a topic that will affect every man, woman and child in Hoopeston and the rest of the country.

The topic was health care reform.

The seminar, sponsored by Edward D. Jones,

Inc., featured Richard Gephardt, House majority leader, in a live satellite broadcast.

The broadcast was followed by a panel discussion featuring local representatives from industry, small business, health care, insurance and the Illinois Farm Bureau.

What got me thinking, though, was something one of the audience members said

Mae Spreghe raised some excellent points, comparing the much-touted health care plan to the Great Society. She said the government is trying to brainwash citizens by saying everybody wants our leaders to reform the health care system when 'taint necessarily so.

There's no denying the system needs work, but putting the government in charge of health care is like asking Jack Kevorkian to oversee a hospice.

There are several good reasons why the government should not be the ones to revamp our health care system and they all center around existing government programs

First, under the Clinton plan, everyone will pay. That sounds fair, but it won't work.

The Medicaid program already has an existing spend-down, where people spend a portion of their income for their own care. And yet Medicaid keeps rising.

Next, little has been written about emergency care under the Clinton proposal.

There's no doubt it will be covered, but what should concern everyone is how much room will be left for abuse.

Ask any emergency room doctor or nurse and they'll tell you the same thing - the average person's idea of a medical emergency differs greatly from many Medicaid recipients.

Those who pay for health insurance consider broken bones, high fevers and the like as medical emergencies, but some Medicaid patients have been known to visit the emergency room for colds and headaches.

> They could've saved the government a lot of money by seeing their doctor during office hours, but they'd rather go to the emergency

> Perhaps health care reform will be run more like the food stamp program. You know the one - where people get food stamps so they can

feed themselves and their children. The amount of food stamps is based on the number of people in the house multiplied by three meals a day. Of course the government is rolling in so much money that it can also afford school lunch programs, and in some cases, breakfast programs, for these children who are already eating compliments of taxpayers.

It seems reasonable to suggest that if we want to know how health care will be after the government gets ahold of it, we need only look at some other government-run programs.

It's enough to make you sick.


