## **Hoopeston Industrial Corporation stock increases**

Shareholders in the Hoopeston Industrial Corporation just got a large boost in their net worth.

Stock, which originally sold for \$25 a share, has had its book value increased to \$91.10 per share, said HIC president Dick Read.

The new stock price was issued earlier this week, following an audit by Russell Leigh & Associates. "It's a little higher than what I thought it would be," Read said.

The price is based on retained earnings, which includes money raised through stock sales. Of 4,000 shares originally issued when the corporation was formed 40 years ago, approximately 1,850 have been sold.

Another factor boosting the price is the sale of approximately one acre of HIC property to Casey's General Stores.

That sale, for \$59,000 earlier this year, "boosted it by a sizeable amount," Read said.

Still another factor in the price is not how much money the corporation brings in, but how much it doesn't send out.

"We've spent very little money over the years," Read said. In the last two to three years, the corporation has spent money on a phase 1 environmental study, which allows prospective buyers to know if anything is buried under the land, and soil borings.

While the tests were expensive, Read said they will pay off in the long run, providing needed information to potential buyers.

Read admitted it may be hard to find people willing to pay the new price, but that "to sell the stock for less than that would not be right."

The new price will offer some protection to the corporation, Read said. People who might have tried to buy stock under the old price will now have to pay more. "We now have some protection against someone coming in and taking over," he said

Along with a new stock price, the corporation also has two committees to develop HIC land.

The industrial committee, comprised of Ora

## Jaycees annual wrestling tournament bigger, better this year

Hoopeston Jaycees are expecting a bigger-thanever field for the 16th annual Jaycee Open wrestling tournament Saturday.

Last year's tournement included 305 wrestlers, according to event co-chairman Pat McCay. "We're about 40 plus entries over what we had last year," she said. "I'm sure we'll have a big tournament."

Most of the wrestlers who pre-registered are not from the area. "It's at least a two-state, if not big-

ger, event," she said. "It pretty well blankets the state."

Many wrestlers come from the Chicago area and from Indiana.

Jaycees try to guarantee eight-man brackets and two matches per wrestlers, McCay said. The tournament follows IHSA rules and uses IHSA officials "which is really unusual for open wrestling."



Baer, Harold Cox, Byron Hedgecock, Roger Ball and Read, will work to find industrial uses for corporation land.

The second group, the commercial committee, is comprised of Gary Trimmell, Glenn Sinn, Joe Moore, Bill Orr, and Read. It will try to find commercial uses for some HIC land.

Read said that while the group was formed to promote industrial growth in Hoopeston, the commercial side must not be neglected. "It's good for the town," he said. "As time passes, you have to moderate your goals with the changes in society."

The corporation is also working to provide a more professional image. HIC headquarters was recently moved to the Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce office at 211 S. Market.

The changes - from the stock price to the office - are positive ones, Read said. "We're becoming a very professionally-run corporation," he said. "We're excited about making somethings happen. We have nowhere to go but up. We've turned the corner."
