City planning commission to recommend zoning variance

In a unanimous vote, the Hoopeston planning commission voted Monday to recommend a variance requested by Ed and Barbara Lockhart.

In a petition to the city, the Lockharts requested a variance for subdividing, which would allow them to sell one acre of land east of the Presbyterian Church on Route 9.

The land will be used as a potential site for a house.

Petitioning the city for a subdivision variance was one of two ways the Lockharts could divide their property, said city attorney Calvin Hultquist.

The second way, an eight-step subdividing process, would have taken more time and, according to the Lockharts' petition, been cost-prohibitive to selling the property.

Ed Lockhart, who appeared at Monday's hearing, told the commission that he will bear all costs associated with subdividing the property, such as running water lines to the land. "I'm not asking for a dime," he told the panel.

Other utilities, including sewer, electricity and telephone, are already available at the property,

he said.

The only expense the city will incur is the \$1,000 cost of installing a fire hydrant in the area, said Mayor Bob Ault.

Alderman Bill Goodwine said when Lockhart first requested a zoning change on another piece of land, which was subsequently purchased by Bill Medler, city officials did not consider the area a subdivision. "This is number two," he said. "It's a subdivision."

Goodwine said by seeking a variance, rather than going through the lengthier subdividing process, such amenities as street lights, curbing, sidewalks and gutters could be avoided. "I'm not saying (the planning commission should make Lockhart) do that," he said. "Just don't do it by default."

Lockhart told the commission the variance would benefit the city by increasing the tax base. "We're trying to get the town booming a little bit," he said.

The issue will go before the city council for final approval.

Former superintendent pleads guilty, receives probation

The former superintendent of the Milford school districts has pleaded guilty to stealing a computer from the high school.

William J. Pearch, 49, pleaded guilty yesterday in Iroquois County court.

He was sentenced to 30 months' probation and fined \$500. Pearch will also have to make restitution of over \$500.

The plea stems from Pearch's arrest Feb. 18. He

was charged with theft, official misconduct and disorderly conduct (filing a false police report) after he reported the missing computer as stolen.

Pearch reportedly sold the computer to a former colleague in the Dana, Il. school district. Pearch was principal there before coming to Milford last July.

Pearch resigned Feb. 28. He was in the first year of a three-year contract with the Milford districts.



Haas, 24, was graduated from St. Mary's College in Winona, Minn., where she majored in print journalism and radio broadcasting and minored in computer information systems.


