Township road commissioner hosts open house

You see them in the winter, moving mountains of snow, or in the summer grading township roads.

But most people don't get a chance to see them up close.

That changed Friday when Jim Crouch, Grant Township road commissioner, hosted an open house at the township garage, 701 E. Orange.

Crouch and his employees displayed equipment used to keep township roads in good order. "A lot of people don't understand the cost involved in maintaining roads," Crouch said.

Equipment, ranging from small to monstrous, was displayed. Many pieces showed replacement values.

For example, Crouch said, a blade for a snow plow costs the township \$150 and can be used

only about 12 hours. A snow plow shoe, used to balance snow plows, runs \$86 and lasts only four hours.

A 1989 John Deere road grader/snow plow, with a replacement value of \$230,000, will be used by the township for approximately 12 to 15 years, Crouch said. It will then probably be sold to a construction company and will last another 20 years, he said.

The township has five snowplows, but only four drivers, Crouch said. This winter was a good test for the crew, he said, because two of the plows had no heat. "I drove one - at 60 below 0 wind-chill - without a heater," he said.

Approximately 108 people attended the open house. "I think it's important for people to see what we're doing," Crouch said.

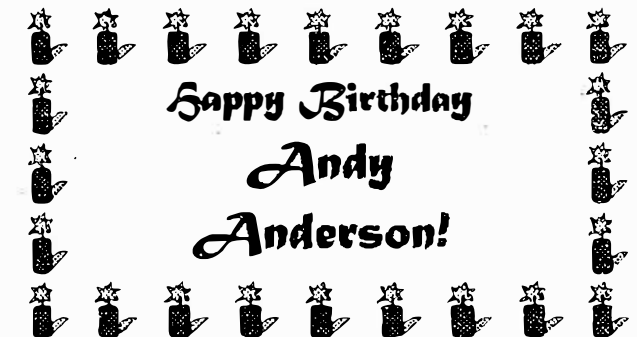
