

DCFS office guarded after caseworker suspended

A Rossville man has been placed on paid administrative leave from the Danville office of the Department of Children and Family Services.

And DCFS has hired off-duty Danville police officers to provide security, according to DCFS spokesperson in Chicago.

Terry Stephenson, of 135 E. Attica, Rossville, was placed on administrative leave April 8, pending an investigation into allegations that children in the Stephenson home have been abused. said Martha Allen, DCFS spokesperson.

Allen confirmed that off-duty police officers have been hired by the department to provide security at the Danville office. That measure will continue "until we deem it proper to let them go," Allen said. Meanwhile, DCFS is conducting an internal investigation into allegations that Stephenson's children have been abused, Allen said, calling the matter a "very sensitive personnel issue."

According to DCFS spokesman Scot Hamilton, Stephenson and his wife have four children, who were removed from the home following a shelter care hearing.

Stephenson has been employed by the department for approximately four years, Hamilton said. Prior to his hiring, Stephenson received the department's usual criminal background check, which includes fingerprints, he said.

Hamilton said he did not know if the department requested a search warrant for the Stephens-See DCFS on other side

Hoopeston police to hold annual bicycle auction Saturday

Looking for a good deal on a bicycle? If so, the Hoopeston Police Department is the place to be tomorrow, for the annual bicycle auction.

Orval Kaag will trade in his police chief's hat for that of an auctioneer, beginning at 9 a.m.

Kaag said the department has approximately 15 bicycles that will be sold to the highest bidder.

Bicycles for the auction are those that officers have found throughout the year but have not been claimed, Kaag said.

The department keeps a list of all bicycles reported missing, Kaag said. That list and bicycles found during a year "don't always match up." he

said.

Prospective buyers won't pay a lot for their purchases. Most bicycles sell for \$2 to \$3. "If it's a real good one, we might get as much as \$10, Kaag said. "We get whatever we can get for them. The idea, as much as anything, is to get rid of them."


Low prices match the condition of some of the bikes, Kaag said. "They're not reall all that great a bikes," he said. Many buyers purchase them for parts for other bicycles, he added.


Money received from the auction goes into the city's general fund.

This is the seventh or eighth year for the auction, which Kaag estimated would last about 20 minutes.










