Fund drive started for Hoopeston flood victims

A local drive has been started to help people
deal with the devastating effects of the April 12
flood.

The drive is being conducted by Just the Facts
and Calvin Hultquist, in conjunction with Com-
munity Bank.

"There is a tremendous need right now," said
Lourdine Osborne, editor of Just the Facts. "Some
people lost everything they had - clothing, food,
beds, even their homes are ruined. Waiting for
state or federal assistance - if it comes - may take
several months. These people need help now.
Hoopeston deservedly takes pride in being a help-
ful community. This is a chance to put that spirit
into practical use."

Alderman Susan Comstock and city attorney
Calvin Hultquist said Tuesday's city council
meeting, where Front Street residents told of their

situation, made them realize the scope of the dam-
age and the need that exists.

"We know people want to donate," Comstock
said. "People have asked if a fund had been set up.
Someone needed to start one, so we decided to do
it."

Don Sherrill, Community Bank president, said
the bank is happy to help with the project. "We're
a community-oriented bank," he said. "This is
part of being a community."

Material donations are also being accepted.
Needed items include bedding, linens, furniture
and appliances.

Final costs on Maple addition presented to HA school board

Final figures for the Maple School addition
were approved by the Hoopeston Area school
board Thursday night.

The project, which will provide one location for
all kindergartens, will cost \$1.8 million, said
Supt. Don Dean.

The cost includes a new office with a reception
area, workroom, secretary's space and separate
conference area. Cost of the addition is \$92,081.

In other action, the board discussed necessary
repairs, including window repairs at Honeywell,
tuckpointing at John Greer and Honeywell, drive-
way repairs and fixing the junior high roof.

Dean said bids received last year on reroofing

part of the junior high were for \$118,000 and
\$58,000. However, Dean said, the district may be
able to get the entire building reroofed for
\$100,000 to \$110,000, using a different roofing
material.

Bids on the project will be opened in May.

In other action, the board accepted resignations
of several employees under the state's 5&5 plan.
Those retiring at the end of the year are Carl
Audo, David Christine, Bob Doty, Roy Dugle,
Nancy Hari, Larry Lobb, Sybil Morgan, Jim
Richards and Jim Root.

Two employees, Gary Denhart and Tina Krebel,
were also hired.

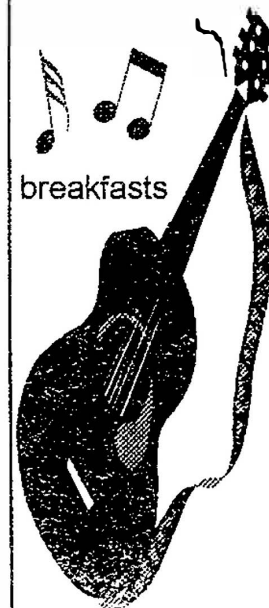



Rossville-Alvin school district receives \$6,000 grant

An effort to use the library to improve students' educations has resulted in a \$6,000 grant for Rossville-Alvin schools.

The district will receive a \$6,000 library/science grant for Integrating Library Resources and Personnel Into the School Improvement Process. The program is sponsored by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Nancy Allison, R-A district librarian, said the grant is part of an innovative staff development program designed to stimulate school to integrate library resources and personnel into the school improvement process.

Student improvement in science is the focus of the curriculum-related project.

Rossville was one of 20 schools in the state which met the criteria to receive this year's grant. The criteria included: employment of a full-time, teacher-certified librarian; regional library system membership; ongoing cooperative efforts with a community public library; commitment to develop a two to five year library integration plan; district commitment to technology; district/school commitment to become an exemplary demonstration site; and a willingness to act as a mentor to other schools.

Nancy Fowler, junior high science teacher, Christina Tracy, high school science teacher, Allison, and Lou Graham, head librarian at the Hoopeston Public Library, attended a staff development conference sponsored by the ISBE. At the conference, the school improvement process and the conference goals were discussed. The team had an opportunity to review last year's projects and see a demonstration using Internet to research and solve math and science problems using a supercomputer.

Earlier this year, the library received the ALLY grant from the Illinois State Library to purchase computer equipment to access local, state and national information databases to help provide books and materials for student and faculty use.
