## GTE to close Hoopeston phone office on June 2

Those used to paying their telephone bills at the Hoopeston GTE office must find another way to pay after June 2.

That is the day the Hoopeston business office will close, according to Ellis Corso, GTE division public affairs manager for the Illinois region.

Two of the 13 local employees will be affected by the closing.

Shirley Cartwright, who has worked in Hoopeston's phone offices for approximately 40 years, is eligible to take early retirement, Corso said. Cartwright and Sarah Miller, GTE's other customer service representative may transfer to another GTE office, or will receive separation pay, he said.

The decision to close the business office was made for economic reasons. "After looking at the volume of payments, it's more economical for us to do it by direct mail, or by phone in the case of service (matters)." Corso said. "Like everyone else, we're trying to trim corners."

Customers who choose not to mail payments may continue to pay in person at Palmer American National Bank.

Closing the business office is not expected to affect customer service. By calling an 800 number, customers will receive what Corso called "one touch service." Customers will be able to ask questions and order equipment without information being passed from one GTE employee to another, he said.

That number, listed in the telephone directory, is 1-800-252-2444.

The GTE business office in Casey, Il. is also closing and changes are pending at the Rantoul

office. the main office for the northern district, which includes Hoopeston.

Conversion from the former ALLTEL system to the GTE system, expected to be completed in about two months, will mean reductions in force at that office, Corso said.

The Hoopeston office also serves customers in Wellington, Milford. Cissna Park, Cheneyville. Rankin, Stockland, East Lynn and Danforth.

Operations functions will still be performed from the local office.

## Wanted man found dead

A man wanted by Vermilion County sheriff's police in connection with an alleged domestic battery was found dead early Tuesday morning, police said.

The man, identified as Randy W. Williams, 39, was found at a rural Hoopeston residence, said Jerry Davis, sheriff's department investigator.

"It was a domestic battery gone bad," Davis said, adding that Williams apparently hanged himself.

Davis said a woman at the residence, east of Hoopeston on Route 9, called 911 to report that she was being beaten. When police arrived, the man was thought to have gone. However, officers found the man's body in a building behind the house, Davis said.

The woman was treated at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, Davis said.

Davis said this was not the first time deputies had been called to the residence for domestic problems.
