Donation request to result in new city policy

A request for a donation for flood relief will lead to a new city policy.

Alderperson Susan Comstock requested a donation from the city for the flood relief effort. "We need to show our community...that we care," she said.

But alderman Bill Goodwine disagreed. "We get on thin ice when you start taxing everybody for the benefit of a few," he said, adding the city should have a policy for donating to worthy causes. "It's a little hard to pick and choose. If we're going to get into supporting worthy causes - and there's pros and cons to doing that - then I think we need a policy."

Goodwine said there is little doubt of the need for a relief fund. "The issue isn't whether or not it affects people or whether or not there's a need,"

he said. "The issue is what's the proper role for the city."

Goodwine said the finance committee will look at the issue and come up with a policy.

In other action, the city:

- ♦ approved applying for a housing rehabilitation grant to help low to moderate income homeowners in the city. The process will cost approximately \$6,000.

- ♦ approved rezoning two acres of ground adjacent to Demeter. The company requested rezoning from residential to industrial to build a warehouse.

- ♦ approved a conditional use for six acres of ground near the hospital, to be used as a driving range.

- ♦ donated \$500 to the fireworks fund.

U of I students present design suggestions to residents

Residents had a chance Monday night to view suggestions for improving the downtown area.

Approximately 80 people, attended a formal presentation by 20 University of Illinois architecture students and five professors.

The presentation concluded a semester of work students invested in the downtown and other areas of the town. The junior-level students began their work in January with a visit to study the area. That was followed by individual second trips.

While in Hoopeston, students studied not only the architecture but also the community's history, said Prof. Jeffrey Poss, head of the architecture

department. "This allowed the students a unique opportunity to work in the design context and meet the people of Hoopeston," he said. The results were to meet "specific needs and specific visions as seen by the students," he said.

Students' designs ranged from the practical to the whimsical. Many featured uses for the second floors of existing buildings. Other students suggested such things as a multi-plex theater, museum and a Sweetcorn Capitol for the city which calls itself Sweetcorn Capital of the World. One student designed a lamp post which expands to provide shelter when someone sits on an attached
