







Health fair slated at local community center

Three Hoopeston organizations are combining efforts to offer health screenings to local residents.

A Community Health/Service Fair, sponsored by Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, the Hoopeston Ambulance Service and the Eastern Illinois Multi Purpose Center, will be held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesday, May 17 at the EIMPC, 206 S. First Ave.

Center director Dorothy Metz said the group effort is a more efficient use of time and resources. "We all used to have separate ones," she said. "We found our attendance wasn't what it should have been for the effort we put into it, so we combined our efforts."

Treasurer lists deposits, interest earned during April

Herb Hales, Vermilion County treasurer, reported that for the month of April 1994, the county has \$17,065,712.85 invested in time deposits and U.S. Treasury bonds, earning between 3.1 and 9.1 percent interest.

County funds on hand in interest-bearing checking accounts total \$2,772,559.47, earning between 2.5 and 3.75 percent. All money handled by the treasurer totals \$20,517,923.70.

Deposits of local interest include:Palmer American National Bank, Hoopeston branch, \$1 million; Rankin branch, \$100,000; Community Bank of Hoopeston, \$1,832,966.81; Hoopeston Household FSB, \$100,000; and First National Bank of Rossville, \$101,906.31.

Other deposits include: First Midwest Bank,

including blood sugar screeding, blood pressure, dental information, glaucoma screening and lung function testing.

Eighteen agencies are participating, including the Vermilion County Health Department, Well Baby Clinic, Hoopeston Multi Agency, CRIS, Vermilion Area Community Center, Dr. William Andrews, Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital and United Samaritans Medical Center.
