# Sewer excess is uphill problem at treatment plant

A possible design flaw is being blamed for a problem at the Hoopeston sewer treatment plant.

The problem, noted in a letter from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, concerns the 90-foot excess flow clarifier at the plant, said John Haughee, chairman of the city water/sewer committee.

Haughee discussed the problem at Tuesday's city council meeting.

Haughee said the committee met May 10 with Eileen Cronin of the EPA to discuss the problem, which surfaced during an April EPA inspection.

Sewer superintendent Greg Gress said a problem occurs when the plant is over capacity. The excess goes to the clarifier, which has no grit removal system to remove solids from the waste. Also, Gress said, waste collects in a sledge hopper

because a six-inch sludge line runs uphill four feet before discharging waste. "It's pretty hard to move grit uphill," he said.

Gress called the problem a "design flaw," and said the city is "going to have to spend some money to get this problem fixed somehow."

The plant, built in 1987, was designed by Daily & Associates engineering firm, Haughee said.

The water/sewer committee will discuss improving the situation and make a recommendation to the council.

In other action, the council:

- passed a policy allowing officers to ticket those who chase fire trucks, hampering firefighters' efforts.
- ◆ approved spending over \$3,800 for nine new police radios.

# Rossville village trustees OK water tower refurbishing

Rossville residents will experience no problems when the water tower is painted if they use moderation.

Trustees Monday night approved Leary Construction Co., of Greenfield, Ind., to paint the tower's exterior at a cost of \$9,985.

The tower will be drained for approximately five days while painting is being completed. Mayor Merv Smith said the tower will not be drained over a weekend or holiday.

Trustees also approved painting the interior if an inspection shows it is needed. That will cost an additional \$4.915.

In other business, trustees approved raising sewer rates from \$1.05 to \$1.75 per 1,000 gallons.

Rates will be reviewed again in six months.

Finally, a town clean up day will be June 15-18. Following clean up, warnings and citations will be written for ordinance violations for junk cars, tall grass and trash.


