Police continue investigation into Tuesday night shooting

Hoopeston police continue to investigate the shooting of a local man Tuesday night.

According to Sgt. Steve Bane of the Hoopeston police department, no new information can be released. However, he said, officers are still were still examining the scene for shell casings and other evidence.

While police investigate, the man charged in the shooting, Terry Sage, 36, of 110 N. Market St., remains in the Vermilion County jail on \$75,000 bond.

Sage, who was arraigned Wednesday, is charged with armed violence and aggravated battery with a firearm, both Class X felonies, and aggravated battery, a Class 3 felony.

If convicted, Sage could face a maximum of 30 years in prison for the Class X felonies and two to five years on the Class 3.

Memorial Day services set

Scheduled speakers include Jon Gillespie of the First Church of Christ in Rossville; Mayor Bob Ault; Sanford Gooden, American Legion commander; Carol Hicks, Legion Auxiliary president; John Teschner, VFW commander; Marie Brown, VFW auxiliary president; and John Lee, chaplain of both the Legion and VFW.

Members of the Hoopeston Area High School band are scheduled to perform. Opening remarks will be given by Whiteman.

Female officer added to Rossville police department

A new face is patrolling the streets of Rossville. Lee Ann Pugsley began her duties as part-time police officer in the village this week.

Pugsley, 40, comes to the village from Vermilion County MEG, a drug-fighting unit, where she has served as intelligence officer/asset tracker.

Her duties in that position, which will be eliminated July 1, include gathering information on drug suspects and tracking property from seizure until forfeiture.
