Multi Purpose Center sets summer youth activities

Hoopeston youth will have a difficult time complaining of boredom with the slate of summer activities at the Eastern Illinois Multi Purpose Center.

Activities begin June 15, with a miniature golf special. Half-price games will be available from 1-4 p.m. every Wednesday through July 27.

Beginning June 16, the center is sponsoring a bowling special at Parkview Lanes each Thursday from 1-4 p.m. Shoe rental will be 25 cents and games will be 75 cents each.

Four days of tennis lessons will begin June 20 at McFerren Park. Lessons, from 9 to 10 a.m., are for children aged seven and older. Cost is \$15, and the instructor is Janet Brewer.

Those who prefer the links to the lanes can take part in golf lessons at Hubbard Trail Country Club. Lessons will be given from 9 to 11 a.m. for four Fridays beginning June 24.

Cost for lessons is \$25 per person. Lessons are open to those aged five and older. Norm Burton is the instructor.

For more artistic young people, Kathy Vines will give outdoor art lessons.

Two sessions are scheduled. The first, June 27-July 1, is open to any age. Nature art will be the theme. Cost is \$5.

The second session, July 11-15, is open to children approximately 10 to 12 years old and costs \$10 per person. The theme will be making paper.

Both sessions last from 10-11:30 a.m. Finally, a one-day volleyball tournament is scheduled for 9 a.m. Aug. 1 at McFerren Park. The tournament is open to students who will be in sixth grade or older. There is no charge.
