New Rossville officer resigns post after two weeks on job

A newly-hired Rossville police officer has resigned her post after approximately two weeks on the job.

Lee Ann Pugsley of Danville was hired to fill a vacancy on the department, but she resigned last week, according to Paul DeWitt, Rossville police chief.

"She left us already." DeWitt, said, adding Pugsley left to accept a communications position in Danville. "She felt that she couldn't serve us as much as we need her." DeWitt said.

Pugsley was one of 39 applicants for two parttime positions in the village. DeWitt had called her application "the best" of those received.

A second officer, Mark Gouty of Danville, was hired to fill the second vacancy.

A new officer, Gerald Hicks, also of Danville, has been hired to replace Pugsley. He will begin training in the village next week. DeWitt said.

According to Kolby Riggle, director of environmental health at the Vermilion County Health Department, food service establishments have been divided into three risk categories.

Those in the low category include taverns which serve no food. Medium risk sites include places which reheat food, he said. High risk establishments are restaurants which cook several recipes and often cook food several days in advance.

High risk businesses will be inspected every three to three and a half months, rather than once or twice a year. Riggle said.

The health department is still in the process of assigning risk values to 250 such businesses in the county. Riggle estimated the new assessment program will be fully operational in two months.
