## New Hoopeston driving range set to open July 1

Golfers who just can't seem to get that rough spot out of their swing, or those who aren't duffers but want something new to do, will both benefit from a business opening July 1.

Tee It Up Golf, a driving range owned by Ryan Devore of Hoopeston, will open on that date.

As opening day approaches, Devore is putting the finishing touches on the ranges. "It's starting to take hold," he said. "It's starting to look better."

It will be mid-July before grass on the tee area

is thick enough to use, Devore said, so mats made of an artificial grass-type material will be used during the opening days on the 318-yard driving range.

For golfers who spend more time in the sand than on the green, Devore has created a sand trap for short shots.

Beside offering 15 hitting spots, Devore also plans to add lessons and clinics in the future. "I'm just getting prices together now," he said.

## Vermilion County treasurer lists May deposits, interest

Herb Hales, Vermilion County treasurer, reported that for the month of May 1994, the county had \$16,486,266.52 invested in time deposits and U.S. Treasury bonds, earning between 3.9 and 9.1 percent interest.

County funds on hand in interest-bearing checking accounts total \$2,772,559.47, earning between 2.5 and 3.75 percent.

County funds in interest-bearing checking accounts total \$4,597,932.43, earning 2.5 to 3.75 percent. All money handled by the treasurer totals \$21,084,198.95.

Deposits of local interest include: Palmer American National Bank, Hoopeston branch, \$800,000; Rankin branch, \$100,000; Community Bank of Hoopeston, \$1,886,387.02; Hoopeston Household FSB, \$100,000; and First National Bank of Rossville, \$108,118.62.

Other deposits include: First Midwest Bank, \$4,455,471.14; Palmer American National Bank, total, \$3,549,576.03; main bank, \$2,449,576.03;

Potomac branch, \$100,000; Tilton branch, \$100,000; First National Bank of Danville, \$995,347.61; Allerton State Bank, \$118,603.46; First National of Catlin, \$101,854.61; First National Bank of Fairmount, \$116,875.06; First of America, \$266,000; First National Bank of Georgetown, \$128,696.80; Kansas State Bank, \$2,003.68; Oakwood State Bank, \$2,353,112.46; First National of Ogden, \$1,907,750.52; First Ridgefarm State Bank, \$207,412.68; Sidell State Bank, \$124,913.21; First National Bank of Westville, \$121,701.09, and U.S. Treasury bonds, \$4,540,374.69.

A total of \$76,173.08 in interest was returned to the treasury in May. Interest to date, from Dec. 1, 1990 through May 31, 1994, totals \$4,325,554.73.

The lighted range will be open from 9 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. during the week and 7 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. on weekends. The range is located on county road 1550, right behind the hospital.

Reservations for hitting areas are not needed, Devore said. "It's first come, first served," he said.

A pop machine and concessions stand with candy bars and other items, will be available.

Reaction to the driving range has been good, Devore said, adding he has heard from people in Hoopeston, Milford, Rossville and Paxton. "Everybody seems to be excited about it," he said.
