

FMC palletizer line sale to affect 40 employees

Approximately 40 FMC employees will leave the Hoopeston plant following the sale of the company's palletizer line.

The sale was announced vesterday in a press release from the company's Chicago office.

Simplimatic Engineering Company of Lynchburg, Va., purchased the line. Simplimatic is a subsidiary of CarnaudMetalbox of Paris, France.

Terms of the sale were not disclosed. Closing the line will affect about 40 sales, engi-

neering and manufacturing jobs at the Hoopeston plant. Some employees will transfer to the Simplimatic plant in Forest Lake, Minn.

Those not transferred will receive severance packages, outplacement assistance and counseling.

Affected union employees will exercise seniority rights under the existing labor agreement.

Rob McIntosh. Hoopeston plant manager. said it is too soon to tell how many people will be transferred or when. Simplimatic has "a genuine interest in what skills they can recruit here," he said, adding the company will be interviewing people affected by the sale.

Firemen ready to detain local 'prisoners' Thursday

A makeshift jail will be filled to capacity Thursday, with people being locked up for "good." Forty-one people have volunteered to be jail birds for a day to raise money for the Muscular Dystrophy Association, according to Lara Conklin, MDA district director in Champaign. The lock-up will be 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Thursday at the Market Street fire station.

Employees going to Simplimatic will probably be notified within 30 days. "The timetable is not something FMC controls." McIntosh said.

The Hoopeston plant will continue produce existing orders for the next 30 days.

FMC announced in February that the palletizer line would be sold or discontinued.

The local plant may be losing more employees as part of a worldwide downsizing announced last month.

FMC announced 1,000 employees in support staff positions would be let go Twenty such positions are at the Hoopeston plant, which currently has approximately 250 employees.

Monday was the last day for those employees to sign up for a voluntary separation package. McIntosh said.

Despite reductions in the number of employees. McIntosh said FMC will not close its doors. quoting a letter from Rob Christy, company director of public affairs, to state Rep. Bill Black, which stressed FMC's "proud tradition" in Hoopeston and that the company would "continue to be a contributor to the Hoopeston area."


