City council bans parking along parade route

Those used to parking along Main Street during the Sweet Corn Festival Festival parade will have to make other arrangements this year.

In a 4-1 vote, the Hoopeston city council banned parking along the parade route, which runs on Main Street from Third Street to McFerren Park.

The action came on a request from Cliff Crabtree, chairman of the Labor Day weekend festival.

Crabtree cited safety reasons for the request. Also, eliminating parking would allow more room for parade participants, such as university marching bands.

"I think it's a very valid request," said Mayor Bob Ault. "What happens is, two or three days before the parade, you'll see farm wagons parked (along the route)."

Alderman Odell Crabtree agreed. "You have people who start parking there the Monday before," he said.

Aldermen discussed, but took no action on, designating parking for the handicapped and the el-

Alderman Mike Eckersley voted against the ban, saying it might be a hardship on the elderly. "It might keep them from coming to something they've been going to for years and years," he said.

Crabtree abstained from voting, Aldermen Wes Dazev and Lloyd Blackwell were absent.

The council took no action on a second request that parade participants not throw candy from cars to bystanders.

Rossville Village Merchants request recognition, money

A Rossville business group's request for funds was tabled by the village board Monday night.

Tony McKinley, president of the Rossville Merchants' Association, requested money, but the request was tabled until the July 18 meeting.

The village has \$2,000 earmarked for business promotion, according to village officials, which would cover the cost of printing brochures promoting village businesses.

Trustee Richard Kiser said there had been some interest in disbursing village funds, but that the board was considering discontinuing donations to individual groups and establishing a Chamber of Commerce.

McKinley told trustes that promoting businesses is not possible without village funds and that as the only official non-profit group, the Rossville Merchants Association should be recognized as the only group to receive the funds.

A second merchants' group, the Progressive Merchants Association, has not filed paperwork to become a non-profit group, McKinley told trustees.

Trustees discussed, but took no action on printing brochures rather than giving the money to a

In other business, trustees discussed a possible Crime Stoppers program in the village. Auxiliary police will deliver borchures on the program, A decision will be made in the future.

Interest in the program stems from several break-ins at Rossville businesses.


