

Bulls, broncs, barrel racing: it's rodeo time

It will be a classic contest - man against beast - when the Illiana Western Days Rodeo comes to town this weekend.

Two performances, at 7 p.m. Saturday and 2. p.m. Sunday, are scheduled, said event organizer Rod Burkett.

Burkett is president of the Hoopeston chamber of Commerce, which is co-sponsoring the rodeo with the Hoopeston Jaycees. $\ \ \cdot$

Both performances will be held at McFerren Park.

The rodeo, sanctioned by the Internation Professional Rodeo Association, will feature seven events: bull riding, steer wrestling, calf roping, bare back riding, team roping, saddle bronc competition and women's barrel racing, Burket said. Specialty acts are expected to include the Thortons, a father and two daughters who work with trick horses and will perform a traditional Native American act as part of the opening ceremony.

The man responsible for cowboy safety - and clowning around - will be Britt Spillman of Muray, Ky., Burkett said.

An added attraction this year is the addition of free pony rides for children attending the rodeo. Rides, sponsored by McDonald's and Subway, will be offered 90 minutes before each performance in the park annex.

This is the fourth rodeo in five years to be held in Hoopeston. A rained-out performance in 1992 extinguished plans for a 1993 show, Burkett said, but cowboy fever caught again, bringing the show back this year.

The event is santioned as a professional rodeo. which means participants earn points toward possible prize money at the end of the season. Burkett said.




