




Board OKs lunch hike

Eating at Hoopeston Area schools will cost more next year.

At Thursday's meeting, the board approved a .10 increase in lunch and milk prices, the first increase since 1992, said Supt. Don Dean.

Lunches for grade school students will be \$1.30; junior/senior high school, \$1.40 and adult, \$1.80.

Milk prices will be .20 for most students and .10 for students in early childhood and other special programs. Dean said the school is reimbursed .10 for milk used by students in those programs.

In other action, the board approved a 30 cent per hour wage increase for non-certified personnel, effective July 1.

In personnel issues, the board accepted resignations from Kevin Wojtas and Julie Maul, and Beth Carpenter as head softball coach.

The board hired Paul devine and Michael Caparula as high school math teachers: Hank Hornbeck. high school physical education.; and Carol Rademacher and Carol Ramloff. special education.

Lock-up exceeds revised goal

The Hoopeston Fire Department exceeded its revised goal during a lock-up Thursday for the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

A total of \$4,011.65 was raised for MDA, according to event coordinator Lara Conklin. More pledges are still out and are expected in later.

The goal was reduced to \$4,000 from \$5,000 because almost half those scheduled to be "jailed" cancelled their appearances. Conklin said.

Twenty-seven people were "arrested" and had to bail out by raising money for the association. Despite the decreased number of convicts, both Conklin and Fire Chief Chuck Fenwick expressed pleasure at the end result.

"This is the first time we've done this in the town." Conklin said. "That's an excellent amount.

Fenwick said he was "happy with the total, happy with those who turned out. We'll very probably be doing it again next year "


