City offices, police department moved to new location

After decades at 229 S. Market. Hoopeston's city offices have a new home.

City employees moved Thursday and unpacked Friday at their new location, the former IGA building at the corner of Main and Second Ave.

The building bears no resemblance to its former use.

Gone are the long aisles and shelving, replaced with rooms for the water and police departments, along with a courtroom/city council meeting room and offices for judges. the city attorney, city council and job service.

The city spent approximately \$300,000 on the new city hall, which was expected to be completed

in April.

Some aspects remain unfinished, said Mayor Bob Ault.

Inside, a new console for police department communications will take three to six months to arrive

Also, some work remains in the cell area of the police department.

Outside, Ault said, landscaping must still be done before the project is complete.

Once employees unpack records and have everything in order, an open house will be held to show off the new building to the public. Ault said.

A date for the open house has not yet been set.

He was released after posting \$200 of a \$2,000 bond.


