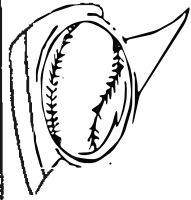

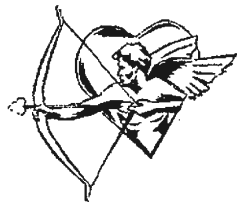

Clothing, residence needed for victims of fire

The victims of a Sunday night fire are in need of assistance from area residents.

The Randy Bruens family of rural Rossville lost their possessions and their home in a house fire Sunday night, said Carol Flint, Grant Township supervisor. "They got out with the clothes on their backs," she said.

Flint's office is accepting donations of clothing for Bruens, his wife and two children.

Mr. Bruens wears size 30/32 pants, small shirt and 8½ shoe. Mrs. Bruens wears size 7 slacks, medium shirt and 8½ shoe.

Their son wears size 8 regular or 10 slim pants, size 8 shirt and size 4 shoe.

Their daughter wears size 6 pants and shirts. A shoe size was unavailable.

The family is currently staying with relatives in

Watseka while they try to find a house in the Hoopeston-Rossville area, Flint said.

The family will eventually need other items, as well, such as furniture. "It is going to be a need, but not at the present time," Flint said.

The family was covered by renters insurance but are unsure what was covered. The policy was destroyed in the fire.

The blaze was reported at about 7 p.m. Sunday, said Lynndel Davan, Rossville fire chief. It reportedly started in a pan with grease on the stove, he said.

The house was gutted by the blaze, but a damage estimate was unavailable.

The Rossville fire department spent almost four hours on the scene, assisted by the Hoopeston and Bismarck departments.

Weather, scores, movies, tv highlights just a call away

Keeping up-to-date on local happenings just got easier.

A new venture, Browling Computer Services, allows area residents to keep up with the weather forecast, sports scores, what's showing at area theaters and television highlights, all by dialing 283-5556 with a touchtone phone.

The service, which started last Monday, is owned by Lisa Lingley of Hoopeston and Vicki Brown of Danville.

But the person responsible for getting the information on the phone lines is Lingley's 16-year-old son, Dean.

Equipment for the service was "just laying around the house," so the young man decided to

make it operational. "I'm the one running it," he said.

Callers are greeted, then hear a message from an advertiser before listening to the day's forecast. Sports scores and other information is available by pressing buttons on the number pad when requested.

"It's a service to the community," Lingley said, adding other features, such as school lunch menus, local Little League scores, a flea market, obituaries and messages from local ministers, are all planned for the future. "We can do a lot of things," Lingley said.

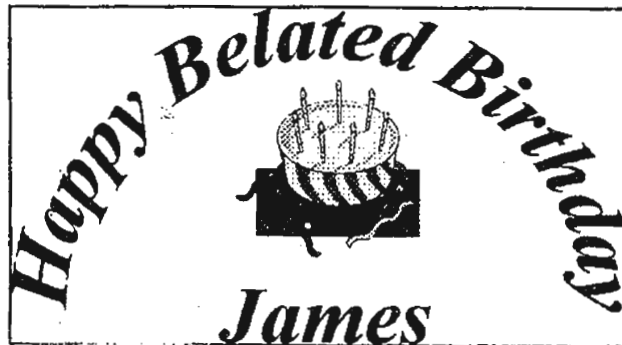

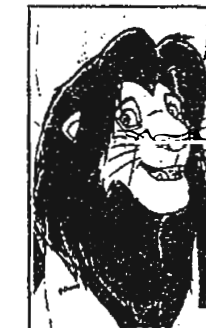
