Shore is leaving the Multi Agency to move to Colorado with her husband. Gary

Lotz. office manager of the Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce for the past three and a half years. is looking forward to her new position.

"It's going to be a challenging position, and I was looking for a new challenge." she said.


