Stokely kicks off what may be last corn season

What may be the beginning of the end for corn canning in Hoopeston started Thursday at Hoopeston's Stokely USA plant.

The first day of the corn pack was "not bad," said plant manager Bill Nicholls. "The first day is always kind of tough because you have to train people and they have to learn where they are supposed to go." he said. "You start from nothing and you take off full-

Although many of the faces at the Stokely plant are familiar ones from seasons gone by, a few newer people - both migrant workers and locals are manning the corn lines.

Nicholls said some long-time employees either found full time work, went to school or just did not want to work the pack this year.

Corn currently being processed came from contract farmers in Missouri. Approximately 3,800 acres of locally-grown corn is not expected to be ripe for another week.

This season may end a 115-year corn-canning tradition in Hoopeston.

Officials at Stokely's corporate offices in Oconomow. Wis., had said last year would be the last for corn pack.

However, floods in Iowa, Minnesota and Wisconsin cut Stokely inventory severely, keeping

corn pack in Hoopeston.

Whether the decision about this year will stand remains to be seen. "Nothing's been said at this point." Nicholls said. "I'm sure thev'll wait until their canning season is done in Wisconsin."

Things have not been the same at the plant since a 1992 boiler explosion and subsequent fire destroyed most of the plant's corn processing

facilities. Nicholls said.

After the fire, the company installed high-speed processing lines. "As far as corn plants go in the U.S., we're probably up with the best of them." Nicholls said.

Installing high-tech equipment did not stop the company from announcing the end of corn pack, however.

Still. Nicholls remains hopeful that perhaps corn processing and the jobs it provides will remain. "I'm hoping this won't be the last year." he said. "I hope we'll be around next year."
