### Repairs to close railroad crossings in Hoopeston

Driving to the side of railroad crossings to avoid the rough spots - and crossing gates that come down when no train is in sight - should be a thing of the past after CSX crews make needed repairs this week.

Crews are expected to begin work today along 2.2 miles of track, from County Line Road to Thompson Avenue, said Gale Free, CSX road master.

Repairs may mean that almost all crossings in the city will be shut down. "At one point, we anticipate all crossings being closed." Free said.

Crossings at Route 9 and Main Street will remain open while other repairs are completed, he said. Those crossings are scheduled for repairs sometime after this week.

The initial work is expected to last through Tuesday and possibly into Wednesday. Crossings may be closed overnight, or, in some cases, for two nights. Free said.

When they reopen, crossings will have temporary surfaces of rock and asphalt. Free said "It will be a little rough."

Work crews will return next week to put the fin-

ishing touches on the crossings.

The crossing at Route 9 will again have a rubber flange surface, while all other crossings are scheduled for wood.

The cost of rubber flange makes it prohibitive at other crossings. Free said, adding a crossing the size of the one on Main Street would cost "\$40.000 to \$50.000 easily." to repair with rubber

New switches will also be installed along the route, which, according to Free, should cut down on the amount of time gates spend down when no trains are approaching. "You shouldn't have as much trouble with that." he said.

Repairs are expected to continue to the end of August, but should be done before the Sweetcorn Festival. Free said.

The last time such extensive work was done through Hoopeston was in the 1970s, he added.

Free admitted repairs would "be a headache at first." but added the result will be worth it.

"Before we get finished with your town, we'll have all nice, new crossings," he said, "You should have a premium rail through town."

## Milford man injured in one-car accident near Bryce

A Milford man remains hospitalized at Carle Foundation Hospital following an accident Saturday.

Timothy E. Worthey. 35, was taken to Iroquois Memorial Hospital, then transferred to Carle after the accident, according to Iroquois County sheriff's police.

The accident occurred at 10:30 p.m., approxi-

mately two miles west of Milford on the Milford/Bryce Slab.

Police said Worthey was eastbound on County Road 1000 N, when he lost control of his car on a curve. The car traveled 126 feet in the ditch, hit a ditch bank. flipped on its top and slid another 66 feet.

No tickets have been issued.




