



true. Wright's best friend is Cochise, a full-blooded German shepherd who also serves as partner to Wright, a Vermilion County Sheriff's deputy.

Cochise is Wright's constant companion, not only when Wright is on duty as a member of the county's K-9 squad, but always. He goes where Wright goes, sleeps where he sleeps. "It's for bonding," Wright said. "He works out of trust and caring."

The dog is certified to sniff out cocaine, marijuana and heroin. He is also certified in article searches and recovery of evidence,

Wright got Cochise, now 111/2 months old. when he was 5½ months old and began working with him almost immediately "He thrives on training," Wright said. "He loves to train." Wright has no hestitancy in displaying

quick "be nice." and Cochise allowed Thompson to approach.

There are advantages to having a dog as a police partner, Wright said. "He's a lot more intimidating than two cops coming to the door," Wright said.

Also, Cochise's drug-finding training makes him "as good as a search warrant." Narcotics Cochise finds will stand up in trials. "A dog has no reason to lie," he said.

The dog must still be trained in building searches, off-leash searches and tracking, but Wright said Cochise will continue to be trained "as long as he's on the road. I'm hoping to have him on the road maybe 10 years."

While a well-trained dog, Cochise does exhibit some human characteristics. On most of Wright's calls as a deputy. Cochise remains in the car, something he doesn't like. "He gets agitated and irritable at me at times." Wright said. "He'll ignore me in the car."

Cochise is a one-man dog, listening only to Wright, "He won't even listen to my wife." he said.


Cochise's not a run-of-the-mill house dog. "You can't treat him like a regular house do because he's been trained to protect himself and me," Wright said.

This is Wright's second canine partner. The first, Sheba, was "more playful. If she wanted to work, she was terrific, but if she wanted to play with the officers, she wouldn't do her job," Wright said. "I need a dog I can count on to be ready to go everytime I need him."

In Cochise, Wright believes he has found what he is looking for. "You've got to be 100 percent dedicated to get a good canine because if you don't, you might as well hang it up."

Wright said he enjoys working the K-9 unit. "In the long run, it's something that will benefit the community, and it's something l've always wanted to do," he said.

**Candy Burton**, 330 E. McNeil, reported Monday that the front license plate was mising from her vehicle. The plate number is NXG288.


**Bruce A. Inman,** 32. of 618 S Third St., was arrested Monday on charges of home invasion, stalking and violation of order of protection.
