

Casey's General Store scheduled to open next month

The outer shell has been completed. sod has been put down and the signs are going up.

Casey's General Store is close to opening its Hoopeston store.

The convenience store. located at Route 9 and Market St., is scheduled to open sometime in August, said Bill Barrett. real estate developer for Casey's in Illinois and Indiana.

Barrett said he was in Hoopeston Tuesday. looking at the work that has been done so far. "It looks like it's coming along pretty good," he said.

Twelve to 14 local people will be hired for the store, Barrett said. Those interested in applying may do so at the Casey's stores in Milford or Rankin, he said.

Tour planned

Casey's will offer doughnuts and other morning food for breakfast. and sandwiches and pizza for lunch and dinner.

The store will also sell gasoline and convenience items.

Many Casey's also sell beer and wine, but Hoopeston's will not because there are no liquor See CASEY'S on other side



An employee of a local agency is trying to help a dying boy.



licenses available. However, Barrett said, if one were available, the company would apply for it. Casey's purchased approximately one acre of land from the Hoopeston Industrial Corporation as the site of their store.

The company went before the Hoopeston planning commission Jan. 10, requesting the land be zoned from industrial to business.

The planning commission turned down the request, but the Hoopeston city council overturned the commission's recommendation, voting 5-0 to allow the change.
