## Fire leaves Hoopeston woman, child in need

A Hoopeston woman and her child need donations of clothing from local residents to replace items lost in a Sunday morning fire.

Candy Burton, of 330 E. McNeil, and her daughter. Jessica. need clothing and small appli-

Burton wears a size 12/13 in women's, while Jessica wears a child's size 7.

The blaze caused extensive damage to the house's utility room, where some of their clothing was, and the kitchen, said fire chief Chuck Fenwick.

The fire started in a wastebasket. Fenwick said. and was caused either by a hot cigarette butt accidently thrown in the wastebasket or a hot ash that fell while the basket was being moved.

Fenwick said Burton and her daughter were not home when the fire broke out, but had been at the house approximately an hour earlier.

Fenwick estimated damage at "in the \$10,000 range, but I may be somewhat conservative on that."

Beside losing clothing and appliances, the family also lost their pet, a cat, who died of smoke inhalation, Fenwick said.

## Rossville officials to smoke out illegal sewer connections

Rossville officials plan to smoke out houses illegally connected to the village's sanitary sewer system.

Village trustees voted 4-0 Monday night to pay \$9.644 to engineers Upchurch & Associates to have sewer lines smoked sometime between mid-September and mid-October.

Sewer lines will be blocked then, and smoke bombs let off in them. The smoke will travel to houses which have storm sewers illegally hooked to the sanitary sewer system, said Mayor Merv Smith.

Homeowners with illegal connections will be notified and given time to fix the problem. Those who don't will be fined, he said.

Beside catching illegal connections, smoking will also determine if the village has broken sewer lines.

Smoking will only be done if weathr permits. Smith said, "If the weather turns real wet on us, it won't happen this year." he said

Smith said the project will not be a popular one. "They're going to throw rocks at you." he told trustees.

In other business, trustees:

- unanimously passed an addition to the dogs at large ordinace, which states dogs must be kept on leashes when off the owners' property. A cat ordinance, based on the county's new ordinance, will be following in the future.
- received an official complaint on the Snack Shak, a mobile restaurant in the village, Larry Ward called the eatery "a traffic hazard and health risk."

Trustees will take the complaint under advisement.
