This list of school supplies is provided to our readers as a service of Just the Facts.

MAPLE GRADE SCHOOL

KINDERGARTEN 1 box Crayola crayons (8 med. size, not Big 8); 3 primary pencils; 1 box Crayola markers (8) classic colors; 1 big eraser; 1 8oz. bottle Elmer's Glue; 2 boxes tissues (200 count); school box; school bag; gym shoes (to be left at school); paint shirt (pull-on) big T-shirt; no buttons.

FIRST GRADE 1 pkg., #2 pencils; 1 eraser; 1 box crayons (8 or 16); 1 8oz. bottle glue; 1 child's scissors; 1 box tissues; 1 school pencil box (cigar-style box works well); 1 paint shirt; 1 pair gym shoes (to be left at school); 1 school bag or equivalent.

SECOND GRADE 1 pkg., #2 pencils; 2 pink erasers (block style); 1 box 24 crayons; 1 8 oz. bottle glue; 1 foot ruler (metric and English); 1 pair child's scissors; 2 pocket folders; 2 boxes tissues; 1 pencil box; 1 pair gym shoes; 1 paint shirt; 1 pkg. colored markers; 1 pkg. colored pencils; 1 70-page notebook for language arts.

HONEYWELL SCHOOL

KINDERGARTEN: paint shirt; mat or woven rug; box of 8 small crayons (each 9 weeks); 4 oz. bottle glue; gym shoes; 1 box tissues; 1 pink block eraser; box to keep supplies; 2 or 3 #2 pencils.

Firefighters spend three hours at early morning blaze

Hoopeston firefighters spent almost three hours at the scene of an electrical fire at 850 E. Lincoln.

Firemen were called to the Ann Halstrom Brewer home at approximately 6:30 a.m., said fire chief Chuck Fenwick.

The fire, he said, started due to an electrical short behind a medicine cabinet in an upstairs bathroom.

Firemen spent three hours on the scene "just to be sure we didn't have to go back," Fenwick said, adding the fire had burned oak wall studs. "Once they catch on fire, they can be very hard to put out," he said.

Fenwick estimated that the fire had burned six to eight hours before a neighbor noticed smoke coming from the house and called the fire department.

Damage to the upstairs bathroom and attic was extensive but Fenwick did not put a dollar amount on damages, saying only that repairs to the "older, well-built home" will be "quite expensive."

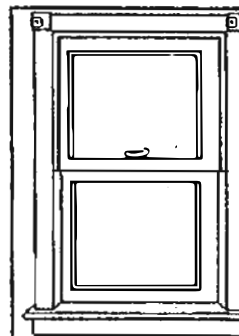
