



Landfill to host educational open house Saturday

Anyone who's ever wondered what goes on at the Illinois Landfills, Inc., site in Hoopeston can get a first-hand view this weekend.

The landfill will host an open house Saturday as a way of educating the public about the workings of a "modern-day landfill," said manager Rich Galloway.

The open house, from 9 a.m. until noon Saturday, will include tours, giving those attending a chance to watch liner construction, trash disposal on top of a liner constructed a few months ago, and learn how the leachate collection system was put in, Galloway said.

Leachate is water that works its way through garbage collects at the bottom of the disposal cell
