Milford library to host 2nd annual Library Daze

MILFORD—Local library officials are planning a good time for residents, and hoping to raise some money in the process.

The second annual Milford Library Daze will be held Sept. 17, said Dean Hartman, head librarian.

Activities begin at 8:30 a.m. Saturday, with homemade rolls and coffee served by the Milford Lioness Club.

Booths open at 10 a.m., and include a farmer's/flea market booth sponsored by the library. The booth will feature various merchandise, including craft items, Hartman said.

Other booths include one from the Senior Woman's Club with baked items, the Milford Lions Club, serving barbeque and chips and the Leo Club, serving cotton candy, popcorn and drinks.

Two 4-H clubs will also have booths set up. The Country Mixers will serve pie and ice cream while the Sugar Creek Twisters will serve lemonade and iced tea.

A dunk tank is also scheduled. This will feature "a lot of notables around the community," including Sam Fanning, Milford High School athletic director and football coach, Hartman said.

Afternoon and evening activities include a demonstration by the Bootkickers from 1:30-3 p.m.; the Community Band, 3-4 p.m.; Natural High, approximately 5-6 p.m.; and the Poppin' Johnny Band, 7-10 p.m.

Other activities will include a cake walk, face painting, children's games and petting zoo. Gillette's Catering will be set up from 2-10 p.m.

Tickets are available on several prizes. Two \$100 bills and four \$50 bills will be given away, as will paintings by Vivian Rosenberger and Mary Fielding.

Tickets for a chance at the prizes are \$1 each.

Bernie Markley, Modern Woodmen representative from Watseka, has offered to match money raised during the event, up to \$2,500. All proceeds will go toward making the library handicapped-accessible, Hartman said.

The library needs about \$50,000 to alter the building by creating an addition or adding an elevator, Hartman said. Approximately \$10,000 has been raised so far. "We're hoping when we get through with this that we'll have another \$5,000 or \$6,000," she said.

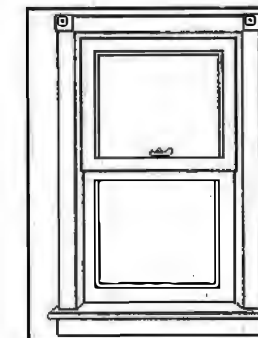
