Rossville EMTs to add high-tech equipment to ambulance

ROSSVILLE—Lives may be saved because of equipment expected to be added to the Rossville ambulance later this month.

Emergency medical technicians will add a defibrillator to the ambulance, said EMT coordinator Roberta Spencer.

The defibrillator "jump starts" the hearts of patients with highly irregular heartbeats, Spencer said.

Two pads connected to the defibrillator are placed on the patient, Spencer explained. The machine then tells EMTs whether the patient requires an electrical shock. "It tells you whether to shock or not," she said. "There's no room for error. It even tells you to stop the ambulance if there's too much motion."

Spencer said the defibrillator will make a difference, especially to patients in rural areas. "If you have to go 15 miles to Uncle Henry's farm, then back to a hospital, this gives him a better chance," she said. "It makes our job easier."

EMTs raised money for the \$7,295 machine in

several ways, including raffles and saving aluminum cans. They also solicited door-to-door for contributions and approached village businesses.

Creative Products of Rossville was the biggest contributor to the fund, Spencer said. "They've been really supportive."

Spencer said the machine, manufactured by Physio-Control of Redman, Washington, is the same type used by Hoopeston EMTs.

Rossville emergency personnel chose to purchase the same kind of equipment to make a mutual aid agreement between the two towns easier. "If one a Hoopeston EMT is with us, he'll know what to do, or if one of our EMTs is in Hoopeston, he'll know what to do," she said. "It just makes it easier."

The defibrillator is expected to arrive Sept. 22 or 23, Spencer said, but "I'm not going to hold my breath. I thought it would be here last month, but it's on back order."

Members of the Carle Emergency Medical Service will train EMTs on the equipment.

No city bids on property

A delinquent tax sale in Danville Tuesday night brought no bids from Mayor Bob Ault.

Ault was authorized by the city council to bid on any of the 17 Hoopeston properties sold.

City officials had expressed interest in buying some of the property in order to tear down abandoned houses.

Hoopeston residents bid on the property, Ault said, saving the city money while still accomplishing the clean-up and "putting the property back on the tax rolls," Ault said.
