Downtown development program completed

After nearly a year of work, a University of Illinois project to help Hoopeston's downtown area is completed.

Hoopeston officials have received copies of the City of Hoopeston Urban Design Study - Solutions for Main Street, portfolios of work done by students in the U of I school of architecture, said Bonnie Manion, a member of the Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce's economic development committee, coordinated the cooperative effort between the city and university.

The portfolios are the work of students under Professor Jeffrey Poss, one of five professors whose students were assigned to develop concepts to improve the appearance of Hoopeston's business district.

The collection of ideas is "a compilation of what

Professor Poss figured was the most relevant work," Manion said, adding that students' suggestions were based on four concerns expressed by officials. Those concerns included attracting visitors from Routes 1 and 9, making downtown buildings more attractive, providing continuity for the business area, and "reinforcing the sense of place that is Hoopeston," Manion said.

"Those are some of the concerns we'd hoped students would take into consideration," she said. However, because it was a university project, "students were not as constrained as hired architects would have been. That's why we came up with so many innovative ideas that were neither practical nor relevant."

Some of those innovative ideas included using

Grant Township United Way plans annual fund drive

Grant Township residents will soon be asked to help others by giving to the 1994 United Way drive.

The drive will kick off Oct. 1, said Chalmers Flint, who, with Sara Fourez, is overseeing this year's fundraiser.

The organization has set \$35,000 as this year's goal, which will benefit 21 civic and charitable groups.

The goal is the same as the one set last year, Flint said. Last year, approximately \$30,000 was collected.

Flint said organizers would like every adult in Grant Township to give \$1 per pay period. "If everybody in town did that, we could surpass our

goal by who knows how much," he said.


One change is being made this year, according to Flint. The annual door-to-door drive has been discontinued and will be replaced by a street-corner collection on Oct. 29. Those contributing on that day will receive coupons from local restaurants for their donations, he said.


Flint stressed that all money collected in Grant Township benefits local residents. "Every dollar stays in the community," he said, adding that while some Danville agencies receive funding, it is only in proportion to the services provided locally.

second-story areas of downtown buildings for such things as museums dedicated to Hoopeston history.

More practical solutions were included in the portfolios, Manion said. Students suggested building owners "restore the original look" by reopening boarded up second story windows and returning them to their original design and removing siding and other modern facades from the classic structures, she said.

The urban design project took just about one year to complete, from Manion's first contact with the university's architecture department to receiving the final portfolios. City and university officials met in December to discuss the project. Students made their first visit to Hoopeston in Jan-
