



Council denies zoning request for bed and breakfast

A Hoopeston man may open a bed and breakfast inn at his home, but his property will not be rezoned to accomodate it.

The Hoopeston city council on Tuesday unanimously voted to deny a recommendation from the Hoopeston planning commission that the Hoopes-Cunningham mansion be rezoned from residential to commercial.

The planning commission voted Sept. 26 to recommend the change.

Approximately 15 residents spoke against the change, requested by mansion owner Peter Krimbel.

Krimbel said a zoning change would allow him to apply for grants to rehabilitate the structure, grants which Krimbel said he would be unable to get as a private home owner. However, resident Larry Petry and alderman Bill Goodwine said representatives of grant agencies told them that while grants are awarded to commercial ventures, properties do not need to be zoned commercial.

Resident Doyle Barracks urged Krimbel to seek a conditional use for a bed and breakfast, then apply for grants. "There's always tomorrow," he said.

However, Krimbel said the structure's condition makes it difficult to do that. "My tomorrows are running out," he said.

Krimbel and his wife, Peggy, had little comment after the vote. "You better wait for me to let everything settle down," Krimbel said.

"We're going to kick back a little bit." Mrs. Krimbel said.

Multi Agency sets sixth annual transportation fund raiser

Local residents will have a chance to grab a good meal and help a worthwhile local project.

The Hoopeston Multi Agency Service Center is sponsoring its sixth annual ham and bean dinner from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Thursday.

The dinner will be held at St. Anthony's Catholic Church.

Tickets are \$3.50 and include all-you-can-eat ham and beans, corn bread, dessert and coffee, said Jeanne Lotz, Multi Agency executive director.

Beside the dinner, a bake sale will also be held, and a quilt, hand made by Mary Gier of Rankin, will be raffled.

Money raised from the event will be used to

fund the agency's senior transsportation project.

"to keep the van up and running." Lotz said.

The program provides transportation for area senior citizens. Destinations include Danville, Champaign. Kankakee. Bloomington and Lafayette, Ind. This year, two trips to the Covered Bridge Festival are also scheduled.

The dinner also funds the local shuttle service, which offers seniors weekly trips to local doctors and grocery stores and twice-weekly trips to Danville.

Labor and materials for the dinner are mostly donated, Lotz said. "We try to get everything we possibly can donated," she said. "People have been very good about donating."
